

RELATIVE PRONOUNS

READ THE TABLE.

This is the necklace. The thief stole it. This is the necklace which the thief stole.
This is the man. They met him in Paris. This is the man who they met in Paris.
This is the city. They met Phileas Fogg there. This is the city where they met Phileas Fogg.
This is the woman. Her necklace was stolen This is the woman whose necklace was stolen.

We use **relative pronouns** to give more information about nouns. We can make two sentences into one sentence using relative pronouns.
