a bill on women's suffrage, which was ultimately discussed without success, but
the publicity spurred the group's rapid expansion. In 6), the group began a
series of 7) and lobbying that led to the arrest and imprisonment of an
increasing number of its members. In 8), the WSPU adopted purple,
white, and 9) colors as its official colors. These colors were chosen by
Emmeline Pethick Lawrence because "Purple represents the royal blood
flowing in each suffragette's veins white represents purity in private and
public life green is the color of hope and the emblem of spring »
After a long struggle of suffrage, the British were able to vote for the first time
on equal terms with men on May 30, 10)
