### The Suffragettes

“Suffragettes” was the term used to refer to a 1) \_\_\_\_\_ of women’s organizations in the early 2) \_\_\_\_\_ century. They fought for the right to vote in public 3) \_\_\_\_\_. In Britain the women’s movement was founded in 4) \_\_\_\_\_ by Emmeline Pankhurst, this movement was called “Women’s Social and Political Union”. In 5) \_\_\_\_\_, the group persuaded MP Bamford Slack to present a bill on women’s suffrage, which was ultimately discussed without success, but the publicity spurred the group’s rapid expansion. In 6) \_\_\_\_\_, the group began a series of 7) \_\_\_\_\_ and lobbying that led to the arrest and imprisonment of an increasing number of its members. In 8) \_\_\_\_\_, the WSPU adopted purple, white, and 9) \_\_\_\_\_ colors as its official colors. These colors were chosen by Emmeline Pethick Lawrence because “Purple ... represents the royal blood flowing in each suffragette’s veins ... white represents purity in private and public life ... green is the color of hope and the emblem of spring »
