

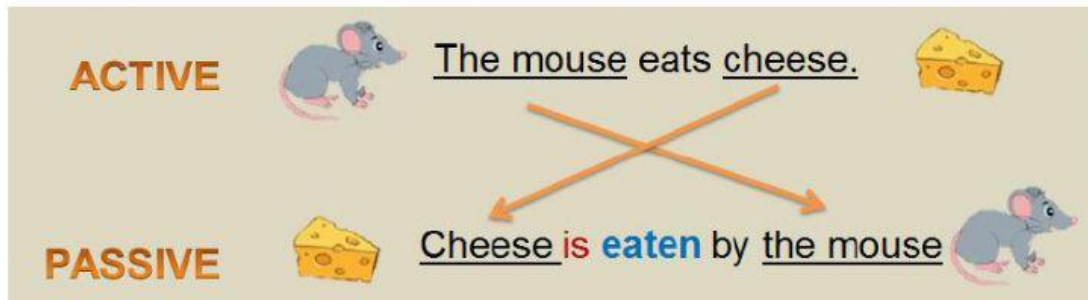

3. The dog had dug a hole.

1. I will wash the dishes.
2. Mike will make a cake.
3. The dog will dig a hole.
