

Could/Couldn't

COULD and **COULDN'T** are the past tense forms of **CAN** and **CAN'T**.

COULD and **COULDN'T** refer to ability or inability in the past.

☺ We use **COULD** to mean that we were able to do something in the past.

Ex: When she was 1, she could walk.

☹ We use **COULDN'T** to mean that we weren't able to do something in the past.

Ex: When she was 1, she couldn't speak.

Had to/Didn't have to

HAD TO and **DIDN'T HAVE TO** are the past tense forms of **HAVE TO** and **DON'T HAVE TO**

HAD TO and **DIDN'T HAVE TO** refer to obligation in the past.

☺ We use **HAD TO** to mean that we were obliged to do something in the past.

Ex: When I was 10, I had to sleep in the afternoon.

☺ We use **DIDN'T HAVE TO** to mean that we weren't obliged to do something in the past.

Ex: When she was 4, she didn't have to go to school.
