SIGN LANGUAGE

Sign language is a language ¹ **who / which / when** uses hand movements and symbols to express words and ideas. The man ² **that / which / whose** developed ASL (American Sign Language) was Thomas Gallaudet. He brought sign language from France, the country ³ **where / when / which** it was first used.

Until the 18th century, people ⁴ **which / where / who** were deaf had no basic rights – they were not allowed to buy houses, receive an education or get married. It is known that quite a few deaf people lived on an island off of Cape Cod ⁵ **which / where / when** they used sign language to communicate.

Today, sign language is widely used. You have probably seen sign language translators ⁶ **where / which / who** appear on television. They use their lips in addition to sign language because there are many deaf people ⁷ **that / which / when** read lips as well as sign language.
