The walls of his home are also covered with medals, photos, and memories, including the white jersey for the best young rider at the 2019 Giro d'Italia, with a dedication: "With a lot of love to my parents Ana and Antonio".

Colombian coach Luis Alfonso Cely says Carapaz is a talented person, has a great power in the high mountains. He is a very calm person, and he is sensible enough. Carapaz's parents travelled to Verona along with his wife and two children, to celebrate his achievement. When he returned to Ecuador people honored him in his town with his favorite food - grilled Cuy with potatoes, mellocos, beans, and sweetened morocho.

A cycling school in his native village has his name and a dozen students aged between 9- and 17-years train there. Carapaz said "I want to be an example to those young people, those children, if they have a dream in life work for it. "Dreams were made to be achieved."

The race began, I was very determined to win it for my beautiful country Ecuador. On my head I was only thinking about my family, and my country.


