The Smelliest Food in the World

Throughout the world there are many foods which smell so bad that it is difficult to imagine anyone trying them unless they were (56) _____. In Asia, the fruit of the durian tree has a smell that (57) _____ compared to a combination of petrol and onions. Eating it on public transport is banned in Singapore, Thailand, and other Asian countries. There is also nattoo, which is a Japanese dish that smells like very sweaty socks. And let's not forget the Chinese street food, 'stinky tofu'.
