

POSSESSIVE CASE



To indicate possession you usually use 's (apostrophe s) when the first noun is a person or an animal. When the noun is plural, you use only ' (apostrophe).

Singular nouns


the teacher's book

Plural nouns ending in -s

the neighbours' house
