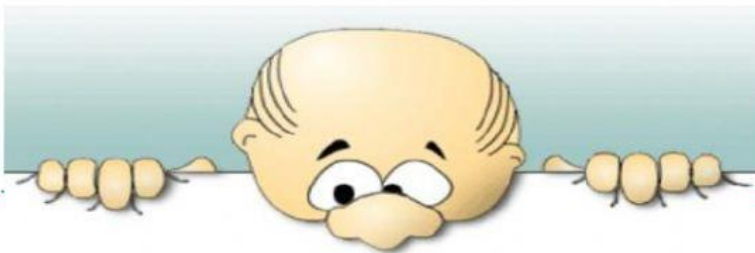


## POSSESSIVE CASE



To indicate possession you usually use 's (apostrophe s) when the first noun is a person or an animal. When the noun is plural, you use only ' (apostrophe).

Singular nouns	the teacher's book
Plural nouns ending in -s	the neighbours' house
Proper nouns	James's car.



- a) This is  (Charles / cat).
- b) (my brother / car)  is new.
- c) (Mr. Smith / wife)  is very nice.
- d) (The cat / tail)  is brown.
- e) This is  (the boys / house).
- f) (the children / toys)  are on the floor.
- g) Where are  (Sally / books)?
- h) She is  (those girls / mother).
- i) Those are  (Mary / glasses).
- j) He is  (Mr. Jones / son).
- k) (the elephants / ears)  are very big.
- l) These are  (Sam and Charles / parents).
