Substitute or take the place of the NOUN (name)

Indicates the possession or ownership.

This is my pen. His pen is red.

I - my. He - his

Our teacher is from México.

We nosotros / Our- nuestra

These are their uniforms

They -ellos / their de ellos

Object Pronoun identify the "D.O. -Direct Object- that is the "direction" to whom the action moves.

- > Give this pen to him.
- > The letter was address to me.
- > This gift is for her.
- > The diplomas will be given to us.
