History tours in BOSTON!

Boston is in the north-east of the U.S., in an area called New England. It is very important in U.S. history because the American Revolution started there.

The first Europeans arrived in Boston from the U.K. in 1620, and built the town in 1630. Boston soon became an important trading center. In those days, Americans were British citizens and paid taxes to the U.K. But many Americans were against these taxes. In 1773, some British ships carrying tea arrived in Boston. The citizens decided not to pay the tax on the tea. Instead, they threw the tea into the ocean. This event is called the Boston Tea Party and helped start the American Revolution. The U.S. eventually became independent from the U.K. in 1783. Every year, Bostonians celebrate the Tea Party on December 16th. They wear 18th-century clothes and throw tea into the ocean!

Because of Boston's history and importance, there are some fascinating city tours such as the Tea Party Tour—a great experience for tourists, young and old. You can even throw some tea into the ocean!
