(BEFORE THE VERB)

I work in an office.

You are funny.

He lives in a house.

She has two daughters.

It is a nice car.

We speak English.

You are often late.

They don't watch TV.

OBJECT PRONOUNS
(AFTER THE VERB/A PREPOSITION)

He calls **me** every day.

I like **you** a lot.

Give it to **him** after class.

I see **her** every day.

Do you like **it** or not?

Can you take **us** with you?

Can I visit **you** this summer?

Speak to **them**. They're nice.

REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS

WHAT IS A REFLEXIVE PRONOUN?

Reflexive pronouns are words that end in -self (when in singular form) and -selves (when in plural form) and are only applied whenever the subject and the object of a sentence are similar (for example, I did it by myself.) A reflexive pronoun can function as a direct or indirect object.

In English grammar, reflexive pronouns are categorized into two singular and plural.

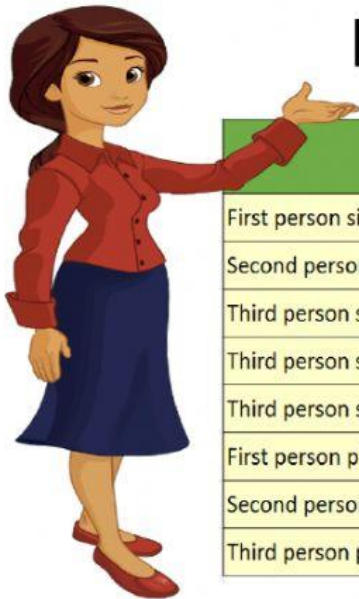

We use a reflexive pronoun to refer back to the subject of the sentence or clause. Reflexive pronouns end in "-self" (singular) or "-selves" (plural).

We can also use reflexive pronouns for emphasis (as "intensive pronouns"). For example, "*I did the homework myself*" emphasizes the fact that nobody helped me to do my homework.
