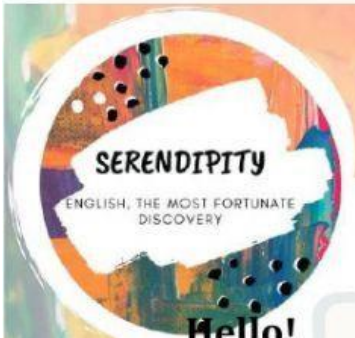

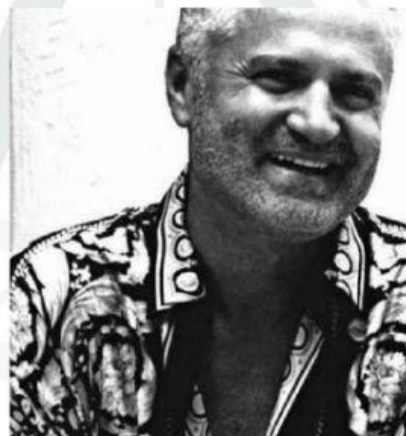

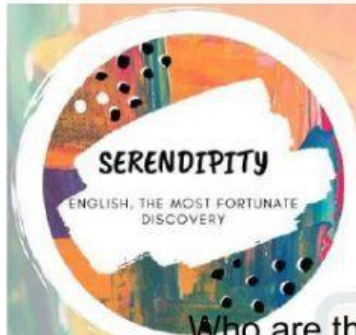

- We often use the present perfect to talk about past experiences in our lives when we don't specify a time.

! *been and gone*

Compare the present perfect of *be* and *go*.

*Mike has **been** to Paris.* = He went to Paris and came back.

*Mike has **gone** to Paris.* = He's in Paris now.

present perfect or past simple?

A Have you ever **been** to Mexico?

B Yes, I **have**.

A When **did you go** there?

B I **went** last year.

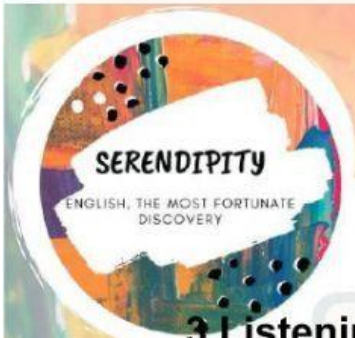

- Conversations often begin in the present perfect (with a general question) and then change to the past simple to ask for or give specific details, e.g. *when, what, where, who with*, etc.

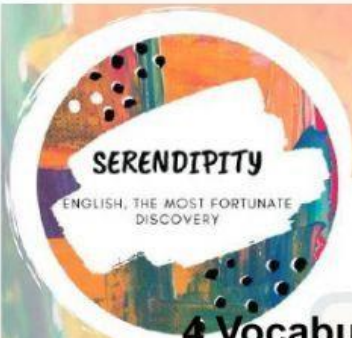

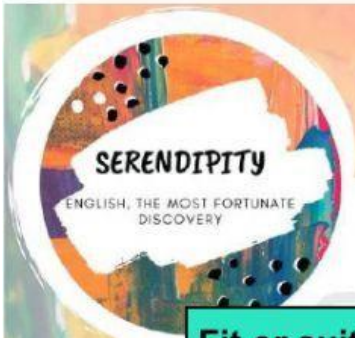

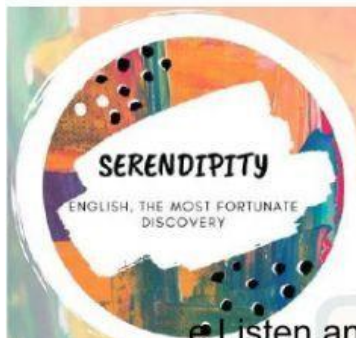

When you are shopping online, first you go to the The first time you use a site you usually have to **create** an, where you give your personal details. You then choose what you want to buy, and **click on** each

If you are buying clothes, make sure you get the right! Everything you buy goes into your **shopping bag** or, usually at the top right of the page. When you are ready to pay you click on "**proceed** to", You then have to give your **address** where you want them to send your things, and give your **details**, for example your credit card number and expiry date.

Many people today also buy and sell things online at **sites** like eBay.

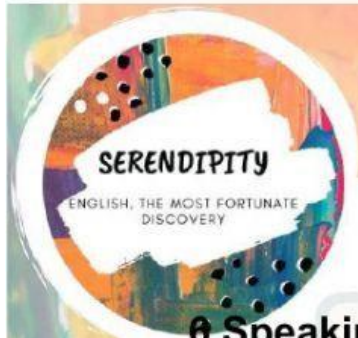
