

Plurals

NOUNS

Plural means more than one. To turn a word into a plural, we usually just add 's', however, sometimes we add 'es'. We add 'es' when a word ends in 'ch', 'sh', 'ss', 'x' or 'z', and for most words ending in 'o'. We change -y to -ies when before -y is a consonant.

Some words end in f we change f to -ves to make plural.
