**2. Phrasal verbs. What are phrasal verbs?**

1	A phrasal verb is a verb + <u>particle</u> which creates a meaning different from the original verb. → Adverb or preposition (of, to, about, with,...)
2	Examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Show up = Appear</li> <li>• Look for = search</li> </ul> <p>He suddenly <u>showed up</u> I am <u>looking for</u> my keys, have you seen them?</p>
