

Present Perfect – Just/Already/Yet

- We use **just** when an action happened recently

I have **just** eaten breakfast

- We use **already** when an action happened sooner than expected

I have **already** finished page 20

- We use **yet** when we think an action will happen soon

I haven't eaten lunch **yet**

JUST
ALREADY
YET



EXAMPLES:

DONE → I've already cleaned my room
✓ She has already sent the mail

PLAN → I haven't cleaned my room yet.
TO DO → She hasn't sent the mail yet.
✗ Have you finished your work yet?

RECENTLY → I've just cleaned my room.
DONE ↓ She has just sent the mail.
