

PRONOUNS

We use a pronoun to identify who is the subject in a sentence.

I, you*, he, she, it, we, they

***YOU can be used for singular or plural (second person)**

But not always we have pronouns in the sentences so we have to think about a replacement to work correctly our sentences:

Example: Camila = she Daniel = he Camila and Daniel = they Camila and I = we
Daniel and you = you

Remember that the pronoun **IT** is used for singular (I animal, I thing)

Example: Horse = it Basket = it

But when we need the plural pronoun for **animals and objects** we use **THEY**

Example: The cats = they The books = they

It means that the pronoun **THEY** can be used for ANIMALS, THINGS and of course PEOPLE.
