AND, ALSO, BUT, TOO

- * Use **“and”** to connect to parts of sentences. E.g. *There are 23 students in the classroom, **and** they are eight years old.*
- * Use **“also”** to add information. E.g. *Carlos is eating pizza. **Also**, he’s chatting with some friends.*
- * Use **“but”** to connect two phrases. E.g. *He is rich, **but** he is not happy.*
- * Use **“too”** to modify or emphasize a word. E.g. *I am playing the guitar. My sister is playing the guitar, **too**.*

Use **and (2), also, too** in the following text:
