AND, ALSO, BUT, TOO

- * Use “**and**” to connect two parts of sentences. E.g. *There are 23 students in the classroom, and they are eight years old.*
- * Use “**also**” to add information. E.g. *Carlos is eating pizza. Also, he's chatting with some friends.*
- * Use “**but**” to connect two phrases. E.g. *He is rich, but he is not happy.*
- * Use “**too**” to modify or emphasize a word. E.g. *I am playing the guitar. My sister is playing the guitar, too.*
