Now a group of 70 scientists and engineers are trying to turn the idea into reality. At a meeting in Santa Fe they are talking about how to carry satellites, spaceships and even tourists thousands of kilometres into space.

Many people laugh at the idea of a space elevator. But the American space agency NASA isn't laughing. It is spending a lot of money on the project.

The idea is to build a strong, thin cable 100,000km long. A satellite will take the cable into space. Special cars will go up the cable from a platform in the Pacific Ocean. The project will probably cost about seven billion dollars.

For tourists the elevator will be a cheaper way to visit space and travel to other planets. But will they want to go?
