- We use 'whose' to ask questions about possession.
Example: Whose car is this?
- We use 'my', 'your', 'his', 'her', 'its', 'our' and 'their' with a noun.
Examples: This is my watch.
These are his toys.
- We use 'mine', 'yours', 'his', 'hers', 'ours' and 'theirs' without a noun.
Examples: This is Jenny's ruler. It is hers.
These are the men's cars. They are theirs.
- There is no possessive pronoun for the third person singular 'it'. ('it's' is the contraction of 'it is')

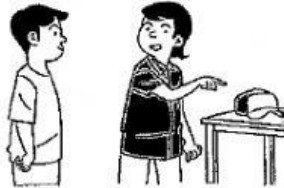
