

# Taipei and New Taipei allow dining in at restaurants, night markets

Taipei and New Taipei have relaxed their COVID-19 \_\_\_\_\_ (1) \_\_\_\_\_ to allow dining in at restaurants and night markets beginning Tuesday. There are still \_\_\_\_\_ (2) \_\_\_\_\_ \_\_\_\_\_ (3) \_\_\_\_\_ in place to stop the spread of the virus, but customers and restaurant owners alike are \_\_\_\_\_ (4) \_\_\_\_\_ to see the change.

A waitress brings food for a customer eating in at a restaurant. That hasn't been allowed for more than two months due to COVID-19. But now restaurants, food courts, traditional markets and night markets are welcoming back dine-in customers.

One customer says she is pleased that COVID cases have gone down in Taiwan and now she can dine in. Another customer says she called ahead and came in straight from work. She says she's not worried about the virus because she's following government rules. She says she will leave right after finishing her food.

Certain restrictions still \_\_\_\_\_ (5) \_\_\_\_\_ in place though. Tables have \_\_\_\_\_ (6) \_\_\_\_\_ to keep distance between diners. Customers have to put on masks as soon as they leave their tables. You're not allowed to walk around while you eat at traditional markets and night markets. Only restaurant \_\_\_\_\_ (7) \_\_\_\_\_ can \_\_\_\_\_ (8) \_\_\_\_\_ food at all-you-can-eat buffet \_\_\_\_\_ (9) \_\_\_\_\_ in Taipei. New Taipei is reminding restaurants that anyone who breaks COVID-19 restrictions will face a \_\_\_\_\_ (20) \_\_\_\_\_ of \$NT3,000 (US\$110) to NT\$15,000 (US\$540).
