Nelson Mandela

Read the text and answer the questions.

Nelson Mandela was born in South Africa on July 18, 1918. He spent most of his life fighting for the rights of people.

From 1948 – 1984 the all-white South African government had a system of segregation called apartheid. The government forced blacks to live separate lives to whites. Blacks had to eat at separate restaurants, go to separate schools and travel on separate buses.

Nelson Mandela wanted apartheid to end. He wanted black people to have the right to vote and the right to have good jobs. Mandela organised several government protests. In 1963 he was arrested and sent to prison for life.

Mandela spent 27 years in prison. After his release in 1990, Nelson Mandela worked hard and helped to end apartheid. He won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1993 and he became the president of South Africa on 10 May 1994. He was the first black president of South Africa.

Nelson Mandela died on 5 December 2013. People celebrate his life every year on Mandela day.
