



## Object Questions

Most common type of questions.

The normal rules that you learn about making questions, such word order and the **auxiliary verb**.

We want to know about the object.

- What **do** you like?  
I like ice cream.
- What **did** you have for breakfast?  
I had pancakes.
- Where **did** you go yesterday?  
I went to the mall.
- Where **is** the car?  
The car is in the garage.

## Subject questions

We **don't need to use auxiliary verbs**.

We generally make subject questions using 'who' or 'what'. We want to know about the subject.

- Who **likes** ice cream?  
Sandra likes ice cream.
- Who **had** pancakes for breakfast?  
Alex had pancakes for breakfast.
- Who **went** with you?  
My best friend went with me.
- What **is** in the garage?  
The car is in the garage.
