The cat, often referred to as the domestic cat to distinguish from other felids and felines, is a small, typically furry, carnivorous mammal. It is often called house cat when kept as indoor pet or feral domestic cat when wild. 35. There are more than seventy cat breeds out there.

36. They have strong flexible bodies, quick reflexes, sharp teeth and retractable claws adapted to killing small prey. Cats can hear sounds too faint or too high in frequency for human ears, such as those made by mice and other small animals. They can see in near darkness. Like most other mammals, cats have poorer colour vision and a better sense of smell than humans. Cats, despite being solitary hunters, are a social species, and their communication includes the

use of a variety of vocalisations as well as cat pheromones and types of eat-specific body language.

37. Under controlled breeding, they can be bred and shown as registered pedigree pets. This hobby is referred to as cat fancy. There has been a failure to control the breeding of pet cats by spaying and neutering, as well as the abandonment of former household pets.

In certain areas outside cats' native range, this has contributed, along with habitat destruction and other factors, to the extinction of many bird species. 39. Cats are thought to be primarily responsible for the extinction of 87 species of birds.
