

The Hooded Pitcher Plant

The hooded pitcher plant is an endangered plant (0) _____ found _____ in the rainforest jungle. Each pitcher leaf of the plant end in a re-curved hood, which serves very effectively as a way to (1) _____ insects. The bright reddish to purplish colours are an attractive signal. The inside of the hood has nectar glands in it, so the leaf is (2) _____ some food to the insect.



The translucent areas in the hood fool the insect which responds to the light these "windows" transmit. The insect's response is to fly (3) _____ the windowed wall because it resembles the sky by being bright.

The hairs on the inside of the hood may look small (4) _____ they are large compared to an insect. They point downward, into the pitcher, and tend to (5) _____ returning upward. The pitchers are long and very narrow. The further down in a pitcher an insect (6) _____, the less likely it is that it can accurately fly up and out of the narrow tube. The pitcher leaf digests the soft parts of insects but the hard parts (7) _____.

The flowers of the pitcher plant point downwards. The petals are yellow and round in shape. These features can be used to identify the species of pitcher plant, although the hooded shape of the pitchers (8) _____ it different from other kinds of pitcher plants.

To enter the flower, an insect has to crawl (9) _____ the narrow space between the yellow petal and the white umbrella-like stigma. The insect reaches the anther which (10) _____ pollen that are used as food by insects.
