Walter Elias Disney was born in Chicago on December 5, 1901. He was a film producer, animator, and voice actor. He got his first job as an illustrator when he was 18 years old and moved to California. In the 1920s he started Disney Brothers Studio with his brother Roy. In 1928, Walt created his most famous character, Mickey Mouse. He and his studio produced dozens of movies, including Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs (1937), Pinocchio (1940), Dumbo (1941), Bambi (1942), and Cinderella (1950). In 1955, he opened the amusement park called Disneyland and ten years later, he opened Disney World in Orlando, Florida. In his life he won 22 Oscars, which is a world record. He died in 1966 of lung cancer. Even after his death, his studio has continued to produce several movies, including The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin, The Lion King, Mulan, Finding Nemo, Toy Story, and many others. His name will live on forever.
