Diabetes is a disease in which the body produces too little or ineffective insulin. Insulin is a hormone that is 9 in the pancreas. It helps the glucose in your blood to enter the cells of your body so that it can be 10 growth and energy. However, for people with diabetes, glucose cannot get into 11 cells as the pancreas does not make enough insulin. In some cases, cells are not able to use the insulin that is 12 to convert glucose into energy. Thus, glucose that is not used up collects in the blood.

There are two types of diabetes – type 1 and type 2. Type 1 diabetes (also known as insulin-dependent diabetes mellitus) usually 13 younger people compared to type 2 diabetes. Genetics plays a part in the transmission of this disorder. It 14 when the body's immune system destroys insulin-producing cells in the pancreas. Type 1 diabetes sufferers need daily insulin injections to cope with the disease. It usually accounts for 5% to 10% of all the diagnosed cases of diabetes. Type 2 diabetes (also known as non-insulin-dependent diabetes mellitus) accounts for 90% to 95% of all diabetes cases. 15 usually strikes older people, the obese, and those with a family history of diabetes.
