

## Making Predictions: **Might** vs. **Will**

1- Read what these people answer to the question:

"What will the future be like?"



*The future? I don't know!*

*It might be better. I'm not sure.*

*People might live longer. But I'm not certain.*

*Cars might fly but they might disappear too.*

*Who knows?*

*I know! I'm certain!*

*The future **will** be better.*

*People **will** live longer.*

*Cars **will** fly! They **won't** disappear! I'm sure!*

We use **will** and **might** to express an opinion about the future

+ **might** + infinitive

*I **might** study*

- **might not** + infinitive

*I **might not** study*

+ **Will** + infinitive

*I **will** study*

- **Won't** + infinitive

*I **won't** study*


☐ We use **might** to say that something is possibly true or for an uncertain prediction or intention.

☐ **will** & **won't** are used for predictions, a definite opinion about the future
