

Loy Krathong Festival

One of the most beautiful and popular festivals in Thailand is Loy Krathong. This takes place on the first full moon in November.

The word *loy* means to float, and a *krathong* is a banana leaf cup. During the evening, many people go down to their local canal or river to float their *krathongs*. The *krathongs* contain flowers, a candle and three incense sticks which are lighted before being placed on the water. Some people also put a coin in their kratongs. As they push away their *krathong*, they ask for forgiveness in polluting the water and also for good luck in the coming months.

By the end of the evening, when the dark comes, there are firework displays. All over a river, hundreds of flickering lights bobbing up and down on the water. The reflection of the lighted candles look like the tiny stars in the sky. It is really a memorable and romantic night.

The first Loy Krathong festival was back to the time of the Sukhothai Kingdom, about 700 years ago. At that time, people thanked the water god for the water. All of this is in honor of the mother of water, *Mae Khongka*.
