There are 2 types of pages in this Vocabulary Notebook. On the puzzle piece pages, you will complete a word study of each vocabulary term. On the paragraph pages, you will show that you understand the vocabulary word by using it in your writing.

It is your job to finish one word study and one paragraph every weekday. Usually, we will do this in class. On days you are not in class, you must complete the tasks on your own. The puzzle piece pages are worth 40 points of your course grade. The paragraph pages let you earn up to 20 points.
