1. \_\_\_\_\_

This natural wonder is located in the northeastern corner of the country near the borders of Paraguay and Brazil. This is among the largest and most majestic waterfalls in the world. You can't miss the Devil's Throat! In this natural reserve there are also more than 2000 species of plants, 80 types of mammals and numerous species of birds.

2. \_\_\_\_\_

This is an enormous mass of ice located in the Los Glaciares National Park. It is one of the most important tourist attractions in Argentina. It is less than two hours by bus from El Calafate. If you like adventure, boat tours are also a popular way to see the extraordinary views of the National Park.

3. \_\_\_\_\_

This is one of the most popular attractions in Buenos Aires. It dates back to the early 18th century, and it contains nearly 5,000 vaults. What makes the cemetery so fascinating is who is laid to rest there. Some of the tombs in Recoleta belong to people like Eva Peron, José Figueroa Alcorta and virtually every Argentinian of political or cultural importance from the past two centuries.

4. \_\_\_\_\_

In the city of Rosario, this monument was built to commemorate the historic raising of the Argentine National Flag, created by Manuel Belgrano, in 1872 by the Parana River. The monument was built from marble, it occupies 10,000m<sup>2</sup> and it has the form of a ship.
