for – since – just – already – never / ever – yet

She has known him **for** five years.

(period of time)

He has lived here **since** 2010.

(starting point of an action)

I've **just** finished my homework.

(= a short time ago)

I've **already** done my homework.

(= before now)

I've **never** tried yoga.

(= at no time)

Have you **ever** tried windsurfing?

(= at any time)

Have you spoken to them **yet**?

(= so far)
