Note!

for – since – just – already – never/ ever – yet

She has known him **for five years.**
(period of time)

He has lived here **since 2010.**

(starting point of an action)

I've **just finished my homework.**
(= a short time ago)

I've **already done my homework.**
(= before now)

I've **never tried yoga.**
(= at no time)

Have you **ever tried windsurfing?**
(= at any time)

Have you **spoken to them **yet**?**
(= so far)
