In geography, a desert is an area which receives **few / little** rain and which loses a **few / lot** of its moisture through evaporation. **Many / Much** polar regions can be called deserts, but most of us think of a desert as being a sandy, rocky area with **not enough / few** water. **Lots / A lot of** deserts consist of sand dunes or bare rock, and **many / much** are near mountain ranges, which take away the moisture from clouds. Others are far away from the sea or other water, so receive **few / little** moisture. Although we might assume that very **few / lots** kinds of life live in deserts, in fact there are **lots / many** of plants, animals and insects in these regions. **Lots / Many** desert plants store water in their leaves or roots, and some desert plants can live for **lots / many** years. Some desert animals live underground. They spend **little / few** time in the sun and only come out at night. There are **enough / lots** of insects, scorpions and spiders as well as reptiles, such as snakes, lizards and tortoises, in deserts. They need to spend **much / many** hours in the sun to generate body heat, so they have **few / little** difficulty living in high temperatures. However, a **few / little** of them cannot bear extreme sunlight, so they tend to move from one area of shade to another.
