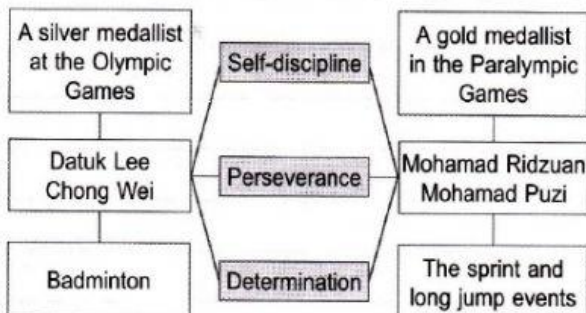

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is the world's most popular English language proficiency test for university students and English-country-bound migrants. IELTS is jointly owned by British Council, IDP: IELTS Australia and Cambridge Assessment English.

As one of the pioneers of four skills English language testing 30 years ago, IELTS continues to set the standard for English language testing today. More than 10,000 organisations in more than 140 countries trust IELTS. Therefore, when you take the test, you can be confident that it is recognised by educational institutions, employers, governments and professional bodies around the world. Governments in Australia, Canada, New Zealand and the United Kingdom use IELTS to process immigration applications. Educational institutions such as universities, schools and colleges use IELTS to determine their candidates' English proficiency. Moreover, multinational companies refer to IELTS to determine their employees' linguistic competency.

There are two IELTS tests available – IELTS Academic or IELTS General Training. The test chosen by candidates should be based on their goals. If the candidates intend to pursue their studies at a tertiary learning institution, they should take IELTS Academic which measures whether their level of English language proficiency is suitable for an academic environment. For people who plan to live or work in an English-speaking country, they should take IELTS General Training which measures their English language proficiency in a practical, everyday context.

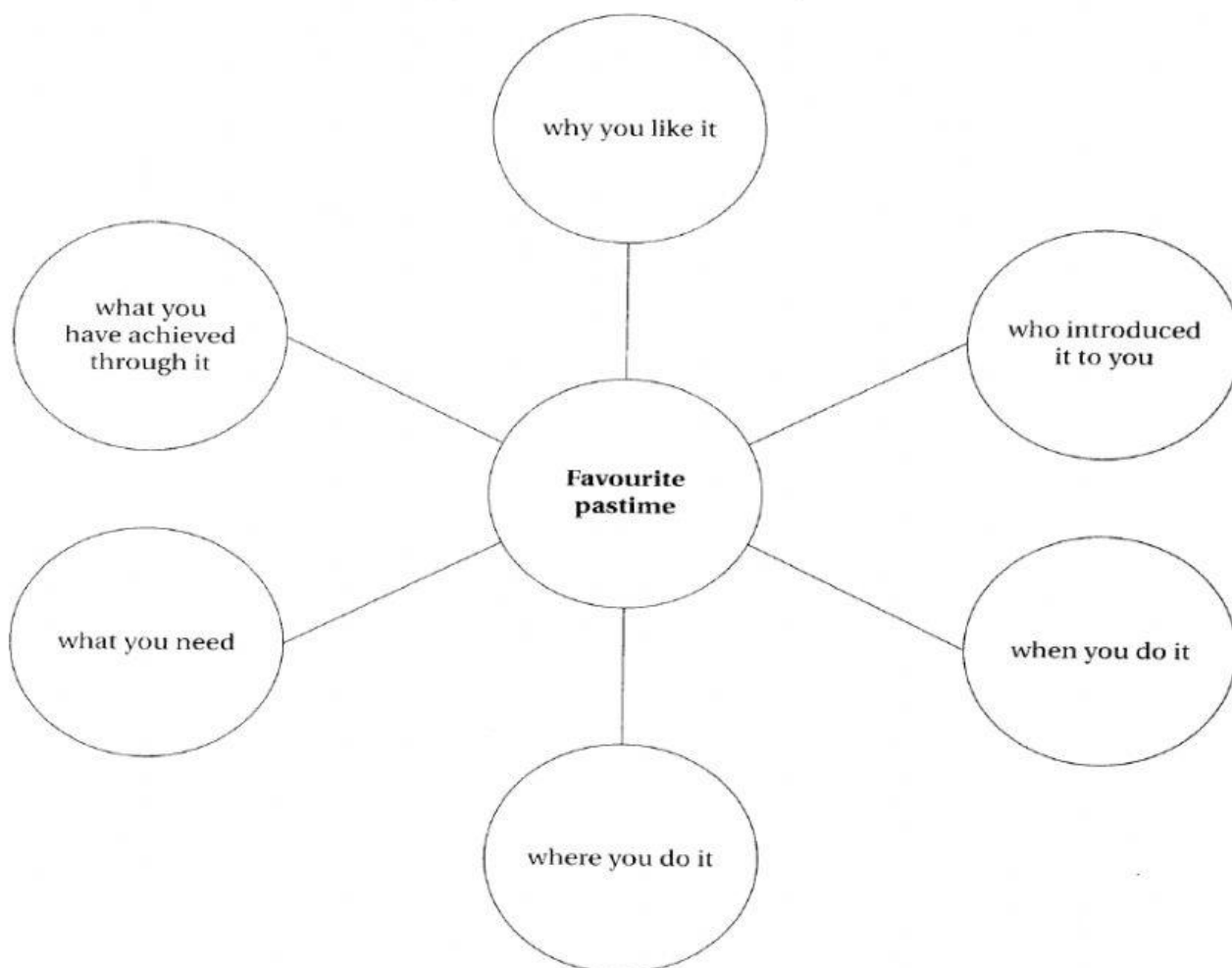
