Form and function

We use indefinite pronouns when we are talking about a thing, person, or amount in a nonspecific way.

Use *any-* in questions or negative statements. *I don't want to do anything.*

Any- is used when it's not certain if a person, place, or thing exists. *Is anyone there?*

Any- is also used to refer to all persons, places, or things. *Anyone can do it.*

Indefinite pronoun	Means ...	Example
everything	all things	I love everything about Paris!
everybody	all people	Everybody likes Anna.
everyone	all people	Everyone knows you.
everywhere	all places	They go everywhere together.
nothing	no things	There was nothing in his wallet.
nobody	no people	Nobody told me the news.
no one	no people	No one lives here.
nowhere	no places	This is like nowhere on Earth.
something	an unknown thing	I think I heard something.
somebody	an unknown person	Somebody heard us. Run!
someone	an unknown person	Someone is watching them.
somewhere	an unknown place	I need to go somewhere quiet.
anything	non-specific things	Can you see anything?
anybody	non-specific people	I don't know anybody here!
anyone	non-specific people	There isn't anyone I can ask.
anywhere	non-specific place	Is there anywhere we can go?
