check in	to leave the ground and fly
check out	to start on a trip
drop off	to report your arrival, esp. at an airport or hotel, so that you can get the service you are paying for
get on	to go to the place that someone is leaving from in order to say goodbye to them
pick up	go somewhere to collect someone, typically in one's car
see off	an act of taking people, goods, mail, etc. to a place, or the place where you take them
set off	to stay at a place for one night or a few nights on the way to somewhere else or before returning home
stop over	to reach and board; catch
take off	to land at an airport
touch down	to leave and pay for your stay at a hotel
