READING: HWANGE NATIONAL PARK IN SOUTH AFRICA

About the Park

This is the largest natural reserve area in Zimbabwe. The park lies to the west, on the main road between Bulawayo and Victoria Falls and near to Dete.

Wildlife

This park is known for large packs of African Wild Dog and herds of elephants. Big cats are often seen in Hwange and the reserve grounds also prove to be a birdwatcher's paradise with over 400 species.

Accommodation and Camping

The park has three large rest camps and four smaller permanent camps.

The Main Camp houses the park headquarters. There are a variety of self-catering accommodations, camping and caravan sites, a bar and restaurant and a supermarket.

Overnight camping is permitted at picnic sites and some of the platforms overlooking waterholes.

Bookings must be made in advance with the National Parks Board. Camping is restricted to one party at a time and during the day. The facilities are open to all visitors.
