

PRESENT SIMPLE TENSE III

When you want to make a question using the Present Simple tense, you also need an auxiliary verb: "do" or "does". It depends on the pronoun you use.

Short answers:

Do	I	study	English	?	Yes, you do / No, you don't
	you				Yes, I do / No, I don't
	we				Yes, we do / No, we don't
	they				Yes, they do / No, they don't
Does	he				Yes, he does / No, he doesn't
	she				Yes, she does / No, she doesn't
	it				Yes, it does / No, it doesn't
