Up is a computer-animated adventure film directed by Pete Docter. It was released by Walt Disney Pictures in 2009 and opened the 2009 Cannes Film Festival in France - becoming the first animated film to do so.

The main character of the film is a balloon salesman called Carl Fredrickson who lives with his wife Ellie. One of Ellie's dreams is to visit Paradise Falls in South America. After Ellie dies, Carl lives alone for many years and eventually he decides to fulfil Ellie's desire and go to Paradise Falls.
