

The Amazon



The Amazon is a great river in South America. It flows 6.250 kilometres from the Andes mountains to the Atlantic ocean. It starts in central Peru and crosses Brazil. The mouth of the river is on the equator and is 650 kilometres wide. The fresh, river water flows 350 kilometres out to sea. Steamships visit the cities of Belem, Manaus and Iquitos, 3.650 from the Atlantic. The Amazon basin is a big lowland with forest and swamps. Hundred of different animals live there. The people of the Amazon are Indians. They are hunters, fishermen and farmers. The farmers grow rubber, pepper and vegetables for the cities.
