

Demonstrative Adjectives: This/These, That/Those

When we speak about or point at (demonstrate) an object or item, we use **this/these**, or **that/those**, depending on the number of objects/items and on how near or far they are. Follow this chart:

	Singular	Plural
Near	This	These



This book



These books

	Singular	Plural
Far	That	Those

That shirt



Those shirts
