

Some people thought that powerful magnetic forces affected the area or that aliens from outer space caused the disappearances in the triangle. Kusche said: "The Legend of the Bermuda Triangle is a manufactured mystery..."

Kusche's conclusion is that the leader and the other pilots became confused. They went farther out over the ocean instead of coming back towards the base. So, after dark, the planes probably ran out of fuel and disappeared forever in stormy seas.
