spelling rules for regular verbs

Most regular verbs add <i>-ed</i> .	<i>return</i> → <i>returned</i>
Regular verbs ending in <i>-e</i> add <i>-d</i> .	<i>arrive</i> → <i>arrived</i>
Regular verbs ending in consonant + <i>-y</i> change <i>-y</i> to <i>-i</i> and add <i>-ed</i> .	<i>carry</i> → <i>carried</i>
Regular verbs ending in consonant + vowel + consonant double the final consonant and add <i>-ed</i> .	<i>travel</i> → <i>travelled</i>
