



CREATIVE WRITING COMBINING SENTENCES



- Combining sentences can add variety to your writing and show relationships between ideas.
- A compound sentence has two simple sentences joined by a conjunction such as *and*, *but*, *or*, *nor*, *yet*, and *so*.
- A complex sentence has one simple sentence and one fragment joined by a word such as *if*, *when*, *because*, *although*, *since*, or *as*.

Instructions: Use the word in () to combine two sentences. Remember to use a comma (,) with your conjunction.
