Characters are the people or animals in a story. When you read a story, pay close attention to the details about each character. Authors help you get to know their story characters by describing them, by telling what each character says and does, and by the thoughts or comments of other characters. Characters may remind you of people you know. They may even remind you of yourself.

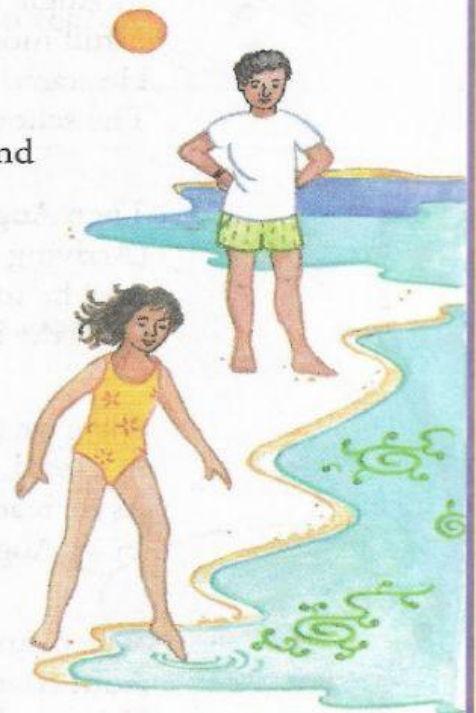
Read the story about a girl's first visit to the ocean.
