Rules:

Usually	+est	<i>slow → the slowest</i>
Ending in -e	+st	<i>nice → the nicest</i>
Ending in a consonant +y	-y → iest	<i>funny → the funniest</i>
Ending in a vowel + a consonant	double the consonant + est	<i>fat → the fattest</i>
