



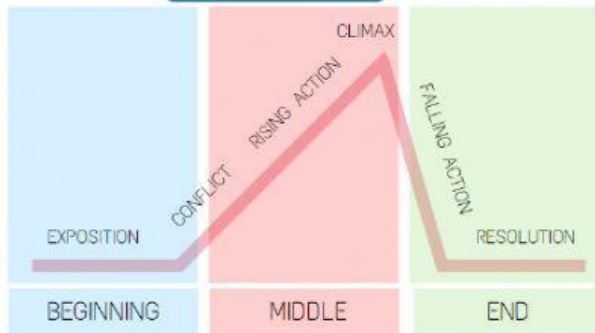

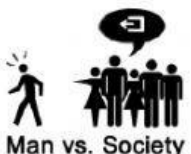
Point of View

First Person POV	Second Person POV	Third Person POV
